TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. The Agency (in other words NGO) should be a National Level;
2. The Agency should have a track record of minimum of at least 20 years' experience of working at National Level on policy and programmatic issues in the field of children's rights;
3. The training will be imparted on Project Basis to Resource Persons, Bal Bandhus, Members of Gram Panchayats, Communities, etc. under the Bal Bandhu Scheme for Protection of Children's Rights;
4. The agency should have the capacity to provide training inputs on varied aspects of children's rights within the framework of the UN Convention of Rights of Children and Constitution of India;
5. The Agency should have the capacity to host a large number of participants from grassroots, Government Departments, Gram Panchayats, etc.;
6. The Agency should have the capacity and experience in the field of right to education, right to protection from exploitation, right to survival, right to development for the welfare and development of children;
7. The Agency shall provide training modules and also undertake process documentation of the training and capacity building in a time bound manner;
8. The remuneration will depend on the nature of engagement and the profile of the Agency meeting the above criteria. This will be mutually decided by NCPCR and the Agency while finalizing the MOU and TORs.
